This crest was built on the same idea with a section for each level of Guiding, easily identified by the colour of the edging. The mountain evokes the image of Chief Selhowtkan.

The main crest section showing paddlers heading off on an overnight canoe trip, demonstrates the ultimate goal for the Guiding program: to provide girls with the skills and confidence to take on new adventures, both in camping and in the rest of their lives.

Brownies can try a new adventure with the security of a roof over their heads at the Longhouse.
